

STUDENT ENGAGEMENT, INCLUSION, AND THE FUTURE OF LEARNING

What would it look like to design the university for the most pressing societal needs of our present and future? What would our universities look like if we were designing for all students? The events of recent years, and the discourse around higher education, demand a new narrative for the role that higher education can play in shaping a sustainable future. This

new narrative must prioritize both integrative learning (cultivating the traits that are most human) and inclusion (seeking success for the broadest range of students). critical role to play.
